

## Arts and Science Council

Number of Meetings: Once a month throughout the Fall & Winter Semesters (7-8 total)

**Nine (9) students** are needed to sit on this committee. Students must be enrolled in a program within the Faculty of Arts and Science. This does not include students who have previously completed a degree in a program within the Faculty of Arts and Sciences. It is recommended students have moderate to high experience working on committees as well as the dealings of the university.

Duties of the Arts and Science Council: -as outlined under Section 37 of the Universities Act of Alberta, the Arts and Science Council is, although under control of General Faculties Council, still empowered to do the following:

- a) determine the programs of study in any branch of learning for instruction in which the Faculty is established, b) appoint the examiners for examinations in the Faculty, conduct the examinations and determine the results thereof,
- c) provide for the admission of students to the Faculty, subject to the admission standards and policies determined by General Faculties Council,
- d) determine the conditions under which a student must withdraw or may continue his program of studies in the Faculty, and
- e) authorize the granting of degrees in course to persons in any branch of learning for instruction in which the Faculty is established.

Within the Arts and science Council there are five (5) sub-committees. Of the five, three of these committees:

- Arts and Science Curriculum Committee,
- Arts and Science Executive Committee,
- Arts and Science Planning Committee,

require that you must sit on the Arts and Science Council as well. The remaining two, the Committee on Liberal Education, and the Committee on Research and Teaching, require only that you be a student who is presently enrolled in a program within the Faculty of Arts and Science. Below are more detailed descriptions of the five Arts and Science Sub-committees.
